The course listed below may vary in number and quarter of offering. M.F.A. or equivalent degree, and one year of teaching experience or equivalent at the college or university level are required. Equivalent experience refers to teaching experience as a TA or career experience commensurate with the course. Review of applications begins 8/11/2022, and continues until positions are filled. In addition, preference will be given to internal prior Pre-Six candidates.
